Parshas Chayei Sarah

concludes with the birth Parshas Vayera of Rivka Imenu, and Parshas Chayei Sarah begins with the death of Sarah Imenu. The mefarshim note that this juxtaposition reflects a vesod in how Hashem runs the world. "וזרה השמש ובא השמש ובא "The sun rises and the sun 1:5) - before the sets" "sun and **(Koheles** hador dies, Hashem works it out that the "sun rises" and a future gadol is born. The Torah tells us about Rivka's birth before Sarah's death to tell us that Hashem had already prepared the next generation.

Hashem runs the world and has a plan for world history. History is going to get where it's supposed to get; Moshiach is going to come. Our job is to make the right decisions along the way, that we're on the right side of history.

Rav Soloveitchik ztz" emphasized that we should avoid a "messiah complex." Some people, in their desire to change the world and make it a better place, decide to cut corners when it comes to Halacha. They alter Torah hashkafa to make it more palatable, thinking they are saving the world. But our job is not to save the world; leave that to Hashem! Our job is to serve Hashem, do mitzvos, observe Halacha, and learn and spread Torah. Although certain circumstances might call for relying on minority opinions, and one might certainly choose to emphasize one Torah approach over another in the kiruv process, violating Halacha or changing Torah hashkafa is not tikun olam; it is harissas ha'olam.

This "messiah complex" is often found among older people, who want to make sure they have left their stamp on the world. They want to make sure they have left a major impact, so they make up a new hashkafa!

The more we focus on the fact that Hashem has a plan and is in control, the less likely we are to have this "messiah complex."
